Thurs 17 January 2013 - Chapel of St Mary Undercroft, Westminster Hall. Service to commemorate the Sesquicentennial Anniversary of the birth of David Lloyd George. Conductor: Dr Haydn James. We met in front of Lloyd George's statue in Parliament Sq and sang there (broadcast on ITV <u>http://www.itv.com/news/wales/story/2013-01-17/lloyd-georges-150th-birthday/</u>) and then we went into the chapel,

followed by refreshments and speeches in the Palace of Westminster. *[Order of Service in archive]* **Wed 6 February 2013** - Cabaret, International Students House, Gt Portland St.

The organisers were trying to give their students (mostly from overseas) a flavour of Britain. As well as a Welsh choir they had three sheep, borrowed from an urban farm, in a pen at the back of the hall. I've no idea what they were implying!

Fri 1 March 2013 - Surprise 50th birthday celebration for a director of Sarasin in their offices at St Paul's Churchyard.

Sat 6 April 2013 - Wedding, St Mary's, Wimbledon

Wed 10 April 2013 - Ted Sellick's funeral, St Stephen's Church, Bush Hill Park, Enfield.

Ted had died on 25 March having suffered a stroke in 2011 and then developed cancer. Members of the LW Rugby Club Choir (of whom Ted was also a member) joined the Gwalia at the graveside where, at Ted's son's request, we sang the Banana Boat Song (Day-O). *[Order of Service in archive]*

As it says in the Introduction, several Chairmen have served the choir over the years, but one that deserves mention for his contribution to the choir as a soloist and all-round entertainer is Ted Sellick. The tribute in the memorial songbook that was produced after he died in 2013 said:

In 1978, a couple of students who knew that Ted liked singing in the pub - just round the corner from his sign-writing business in Islington - suggested he go along to the London Welsh Centre in Gray's Inn Road. The little man with a Captain Birdseye beard and a twinkle in his eye joined the Gwalia as a top tenor. Soon he became one of the Choir's key members performing solos in concerts and keeping everyone entertained in the bar afterwards. Ted was a thoroughbred Londoner, without a drop of Welsh blood in his veins. But he loved the Choir and we loved him. Ted contributed selflessly to the life of the London Welsh Centre in so many ways: the signage and other work he carried out in the building were just as important as the musical evenings he presented. He was the Gwalia's chairman from 2005 to 2012. Ted was a lovely man and it is a real privilege to have known him.

<u>Ken Brickell writes:</u> I have been greatly saddened every time I read Ted's name. He was such a wonderful man. My father-in-law was about 5'5" tall and I always describe him as the biggest man I ever knew. Ted was in the same bracket. I loved him to bits. It was always agreed that if ever Elaine and I tied the knot, Ted was to be my Best Man. **Thurs 16 May 2013** - Wedding, Church of the Sacred Heart, Edge Hill, Wimbledon [Order of Service in archive] **Sat 1 June 2013** - Wedding in British Medical Association House, Tavistock Sq [Order of Service in archive] **Sat 6 July 2013** - Joint Concert with Monmouth MVC in St Mary's Priory Church, Monmouth **Wed 24 July 2013** - Dave Hurlbut's 'thankyou party', London Welsh Centre & Calthorpe Arms. Sat 26 September 2015 - Part of the entertainment in the Wales Supporters Village prior to the England v Wales World Cup match. Old Deer Park Richmond. Joint with LW Rugby Club Choir. James Hearn conducted. **Tues 20 October 2015** - Seven of the choir went along for an informal (unofficial) sing-song at the Colton Arms in West Kensington. We had gone in there after our concert on 7 March in nearby St Andrews church, and the landlord had asked us to come back to help his mother celebrate 50 years as landlady of the pub.

Friday 27 May 2016 - Funeral in Paris of Richard Osman the only Briton killed when the Egyptair flight crashed. *Email from Steve Davies: At midday on Wednesday I received a call from someone asking whether 5 or 6 of us could sing in a memorial service. I said it depended on when and where, to which he said it would be less than two days later in Paris. At that stage he did not say it was for Welshman, Richard Osman, the only Briton on the Egypt Air flight that was brought down 10 days ago. After a few hurried phone calls I had 5 singers who could do this at such short notice - Mike Davies, Richard Killoughery and me from the Gwalia and Dai 'Dogs' Surridge and Arthur Simpson from the LW Rugby choir. We booked our Eurostar tickets and a hotel near Gare du Nord, and arrived in Paris on Thursday night. On the following morning we arrived early for a rehearsal in the chapel of the ancient Abbey church of St Germain des Pres on*

the left bank. Richard Osman was 40 and was married to a French lady, Aurelie, who had given birth to their second daughter just five weeks ago. His brothers and sister and work colleagues and friends were there, many in Welsh rugby shirts, and the chapel was standing-room only. As you can imagine it was a very emotional occasion. After Aurelie and the brothers had spoken, the Order of Service said 'Bread of Heaven - Cor Meibion Gwalia'. We were nervous that just 5 of would be able to pull this off but I am proud to say that we did, and the whole choir should be proud too. As the mourners were paying their respects to Aurelie at the entrance to the church we sang several more songs and then Hen Wlad Fy Nhadau. Our travel and hotel costs will be covered, but there was no fee involved - we were just honoured and privileged to be asked to take part. We received several compliments about our performance and many said that we helped to make the day very special and memorable - it certainly was for us. [Order of Service in archive]

The registered number is: 1169319 and our charitable objectives are:

1. to advance, improve, develop and maintain public education in, and appreciation of, the art and science of choral music in all its aspects (in particular by the continuation of the tradition of Welsh choral music) by way of public concerts and recitals; 2. to further such charitable purposes as the Trustees in their absolute discretion shall think fit.

Basically, what we do has to benefit the public in some way - and that includes the enjoyment people get from hearing us perform whether in a concert or private engagement.

Extract from London Welsh Magazine: Vive les choeurs d'hommes

The Gwalia has recently returned from an emotional trip to France where we commemorated those who fell in the Battle of the Somme 100 years ago. At a short informal ceremony attended by the local Mayor we laid a wreath, read poems and sang Sospan Fach (famously sung by the men in the trenches) at the memorial, in the form of a dragon, to the Welsh Regiment who fought a bitter battle at Mametz Wood and where so many Welshmen were killed or wounded. That evening we took part in a concert in the church organised by Choeur d'Hommes Agache who we had contacted some months previously. The choirs sang in each half of the concert, and the Mayor spoke very movingly about the deep respect and gratitude which the village of Mametz holds for those who gave their lives in its defence. Indeed, at the end of the concert several children sang along with Hen Wlad Fy Nhadau which we discovered they are taught in the village school - an amazing tribute to those who fought there.

Earlier in the day the choir and supporters had gathered in a church near our hotel in the centre of Arras to observe a minute's silence to coincide precisely with the commemorations taking place in Wales to mark the 50th Anniversary of the Aberfan disaster. This was followed by a heartfelt rendition of Myfanwy, a song that means so much to the families of the victims of the terrible event.

During our five day tour visits were made to the largest German cemetery in France and the Canadian memorial at Vimy. However, the weekend wasn't an entirely sombre affair; we managed to sample some fine bières Artois and regional cuisine, and took part in an entertaining concert with our new friends in the Agache Male Choir. They had made the arrangements for our first concert and invited us to share a concert with them in their own church in Pérenchies, a town some 90 minutes north of Mametz between the Belgium border and Lille. As with the previous evening, the church was full and the performance very well received. At the civic reception after the concert we were pleased to hear the French choir accept our invitation to sing with us in London in the near future, and the deputy mayor invited us back to Perénchies in 2018 to mark the centenary of the end of the Great War.

Since our last report, in addition to our very memorable few days in France, the Gwalia has taken part in weddings at two superb venues - Jewin Welsh chapel in the City of London and at the historic Church in Inner Temple. Also, in readiness for our 50th Anniversary celebrations next year, we have released a new CD titled 'O Gymru', an advert for which appears elsewhere in this issue.

A small group representing the Gwalia were privileged to sing last May at the funeral in Paris of Richard Osman, the only Briton on the Egypt Air flight that had been brought down that month, and in November we were honoured to be asked by Richard's family to perform in a little church near Carmarthen at a very moving memorial service.

As the year drew to a close we went carol-singing at the Great Northern Hotel in Kings Cross and in a couple of hours raised an impressive £440 for London's Air Ambulance.

A week later the Gwalia literally had its name up in lights in Piccadilly Circus when, on a specially erected stage next to Eros, we performed to a large West End crowd. Samsung were sponsoring the 'Advent Choir of the World' in which a choir from a different country sang each night in the run-up to Christmas, and the Gwalia was proud to be the choir representing Wales.

Book Reviews

Gwalia members have been responsible the publication in 2017 of two books - one light-hearted, the other serious.

'The Nant Tarw Saga'

To celebrate the Gwalia Male Choir's 50th Anniversary, Dave Hurlbut and Honorary Member, Ron 'Tidy' Williams have produced 'The Nant Tarw Saga'. This is a collection of short stories written by two founder members of the Gwalia, John Evans and Wynne Davies, both of whom, regrettably, no longer with us. The Saga first appeared in 'Tempo Gwalia' the choir's in-house magazine in the 1980's and 90's, and it recounts the trials and tribulations of a fictional choir in Wales. It is very entertaining, and certain characters will be recognisable amongst those who were, or still are, in the choirs at the London Welsh Centre.

Ron and Dave have generously agreed that all proceeds from the sale of the book will be donated to the London Welsh Centre Trust.

'The Lost Sons of Penycae'

The second book that has just been published is 'The Lost Sons of Penycae' by Gwalia top tenor Barry Jones whose family still live in the village of Penycae near Rhosllanerchrugog outside Wrexham. The village's War Memorial has grown so familiar that it attracts little more than a passing glance these days, except on Remembrance Day. This book remembers the courage and sacrifice of the 37 men whose names are engraved on it. In such a small community, everyone knew someone who had died. This is the story of the men who went to war and didn't come home and how the village changed in the two World wars. It gives a fascinating insight into the war time history and tells the sad and poignant stories of the brave men of this little village near Wrexham.
