Steve Davies says: This was a massive undertaking organised by John Evans and Wynne Davies of the Gwalia. There were 19 choirs from Wales* and 9 from Holland. Several coaches came up from Wales (some were double-deckers that found they couldn't get under the low bridges on some of the local roads). There had been rehearsals in Wales taken by Wendy and then there was a concert for the Welsh choirs in Aberavon on 7 April. The concerts in Holland were in enormous exhibition halls and the stage was incredibly wide. It was an experience, but singing amongst 500 baritones meant I couldn't hear the other parts!

The Albert Hall had been booked for the return concert the following year, but the Dutch partner (allegedly) disappeared with the money and it had to be cancelled.

* The Welsh Choirs were: Talgarth; Cardiff; Caerphilly; Pontypridd; Burry Port; Tredegar; Whitchurch; Whitland; Caernarfon; Rhos; Newport; Swansea; Bridgend; Caron; Gwalia; Aberystwyth; Carmarthen; Cwmann; Caldicot.

One of the Soloists was Vicki Brown, wife of Joe Brown (and his Bruvvers). She was very popular in Holland.

A copy of the Western Mail 'Weekender Leisure Magazine' is available to view in the archive. The front page is devoted to a review of the Dutch Tour and the up-coming concert in Afon Lido, Port Talbot. Interestingly, on the back page of the same issue there is a 'London Welsh Centre special report' which reviewed the recently re-opened Centre which had been closed for 12 months for major improvement works.

Planning has been underway for six months for the Festival which will be the biggest of its kind to involve British choirs. Meetings have been held with representatives of sixteen Welks and seven Dutch choirs, discussions have taken place at the Dutch Embassy in London and the British Embassy in the Hague, with shipping and coach companies and with commercial organisations. Sixteen hundred beds have been booked in the Netherlands for 1990 and a similar number in London in 1991. The Clau ferry from Sheermess and the Sealink ferry from Harwich have been reserved for our choirs and supporters.

Interest in the Pestival is already high in Wales and in Holland. Sixteen Welsh choi are already involved, some having almost all their members signed up for the visit to the Netherlands. Although we have not yet formally publicised the venture a number cother choirs are seeking to be included. Those already accepted are i-

Swanssa; Bridgend; Whitchurch; Cardiff; Caldicot; Burry Fort Aberystwyth; Onllwyn; Tredegar; Fort Talbot; Rhos Cwatawe; Talgarth; Caerphilly; Pontypridd, Carmarthen and Gwalia. Four others including the County of Commall are to respond shortly. The Dutch 1000 voices will be drawn from seven choirs.

The itinerary for 1990 is attached together with the concert programme. The first of the concerts will be at the Netherlands Congress Centre at the Hague. It holds 7000 together with a choir of 2000. The second which will be given by the Welsh choirs only will be in Apeldoorn to an audience of 2000 which will include representatives of the Dutch Royal family.

Wendy will rehearse the Welsh choirs in regional rehearsals during the winter and a final pre-Festival rehearsal and public concert will be held in Wales. This will probably be on April 7th so please note this in your diary as every chorister will be required to attend. This concert will be recorded.

The cost to choristers will be £130. This to include :-

All coach travel; Sea crossings with cabin accommodation outward; Hotel accommodation in twin-bedded rooms; Four breakfasts and three dinners; Excursions in Holland.

The cost to supporters is £140. Personal insurance is not included in this price. Each chorister may bring one supporter to share a twin room.

Sponsorship is being sought and the initial response is encouraging. Any revenue remaining after costs have been defrayed will be distributed between choirs on a per capita basis. We have a number of engagements already arranged for the Gwmlia over the next few months including three cabaret bookings which will be good for choir funds. If you give support to these and others thich we could obtain, this could reduce the cost to Gwmlia members quite considerably.

Some further information which may be of interest at this stage :-

Dutch Commercial Television is to produce a programme on the Festival. Discussions are to take place shortly with Harlech Television.

A commemorative tie will be available for purchase by choristers and supporters before we leave for Holland.

Members of the Dutch choirs will be on hand over the period of our visit to act as hosts, but in addition we have arranged for a trained travel courier to be assigned to each of our choirs when in Holland. She will travel with the choir and be based at the choir hotel.

The task of organizing a venture which involves over 3000 people in total, sixty or so coaches, many hotels and lengthy negotiations over a range of other aspects, is quite considerable. The events in 1990 and 1991 are likely to receive extensive coverage, and the Gwelie is in the forefront of the venture.

There is enthusiasm amongst Welch and Dutch choirs with many chomisters in both countries going to great lengths to ensure that heliday arrangements are made to enable them to be with us for the Festival. This is the biggest venture with which we have been associated in our 21 years and we hope that given our prime position, you will all show the same level of commitment and be sure to give the choir your support by being with us in Holleand. When the Festival is in London we shall be the hosts and that will be an occasion when we hope that all members will make themselves available to join working parties in the proparations for the visit by the Dutch choristers and their supporters, and by making youselves available over the weekend to help us entertain them. With one full year to arrange for the visit to Holland and two years before they visit us, it should not be too difficult to give this venture high priority in your planning.

Given the scale of this unique venture there has to be firm commitment from every chorister so a deposit of \$25 per member (and supporter) will be required by Jung 26th. Please give you names to the Hon. Secretary on the enclosed slip and make cheques payable to 'Gwalia Male Choir'. We have to confirm bookings of hotel rooms and sea crossing shortly and cannot delay acceptance of deposits. We will not be able to guarantee places for any member who wishes to delay payment.

We look forward to your participation and your help in ensuring that this Westival is the success that it promises to be.
