Floodlit performance in front of the Grandstand with the Band of the Welsh Gurds, the Pipe Band of the scots Guards Assoc, Leonie Page (soprano) and the Guns of 16 Regiment Royal Artillery.

We were asked to stay in position on the temporary stage while the Band played the 1812 Overture. When the cannon went off right behind us we all jumped out of our skins!

14 November 1998 - After the Show we jumped on a coach and went to Gorleston in Norfolk and straight on stage as part of the Gorleston Music Festival.

29 April 1999 - Chairman Wynne Davies died aged 68. A founder member of the Gwalia, a great supporter of the London Welsh Association and LW Rugby Club, Wynne had been at rehearsal the previous evening. It was a dreadful shock. His funeral was at Streatham Park Crem on 10 May.

By Russell Jones – fellow chorister: Wynne Davies was born in Penclawdd near Swansea and was educated at Gowerton Grammar School and University of Wales where he graduated in Education. In Penclawdd he was brought up with his cousin Carl Jenkins, the famous composer. He came to London in 1954 as a National Serviceman where he was Senior Instructor with the Army Education centre at the Royal Artillery Depot, Woolwich, where he played rugby for London Command. Wynne married in 1955 and after his Army Service he joined Tulse Hill Comprehensive in 1956 and later became Head of Upper School. In the mid-60s he moved to Goldsmiths College, where he lectured in Educational Policy and Management.

In London Welsh Circles, Wynne was Secretary of the London Welsh Trust and Association from 1983 to 1990 and its Chairman from 1996 to 1998. He was also Vice President of the London Welsh rugby Club for 16 years. He attended the Boro Welsh Congregational Chapel where he was a Deacon and Trustee from 1985.

28-31 May 1999 - Antwerp

Steve Davies says: We have been to Antwerp a few times, and I think this is the time when the coach we hired was not the most modern, and unfortunately it broke down near Dunkirk. We managed to pull off the motorway into an industrial estate. I was the only one who had a mobile phone that would work abroad, and the driver used it to call his office. They arranged for a Volvo repair truck to come from Calais. The rear suspension had collapsed and when the mechanic said it could take quite a while to fix, the tour party split up to search for a bar - some went east and others went west. Others chose to remain on the grass verge with Dai Pres and open their Duty Frees - a big mistake when Dai Pres is about! The mechanic fixed the problem more quickly than we had expected, so we then had to try to round everyone up. As I was walking back to the coach I could see that one of our newer members had been sick and had collapsed on the ground - too much Dunkirk spirit! Mike was using the coach driver's broom to clean him up. But that wasn't the worst of it - Bryn had had a funny turn and had been carted off to hospital in an ambulance!

We all got back on the bus and decided to find the hospital to see how Bryn was. We could see the hospital but couldn't work out how to get there - eventually I knocked on the door of a house to ask for directions, but as I couldn't understand the lingo, she sad 'Follow me' and jumped in her car and led the coach to the hospital. Everywhere seemed closed but Dr Hilary James and I got in through the loading bay and we somehow found the ward where Bryn was - in bed linked up to a drip. The doctor wiggled his fingers indicating the universal sign that Bryn was 'tipsy' and said he ought to remain overnight. Bryn lived in Kent, and at that point he was nearer home than he was to our ultimate destination. We made sure he had enough money and suggested he make his way back the following day. Not surprisingly we arrived at our hotel in Antwerp much later than expected but it didn't dampen our spirits. The following morning, much to everyone's surprise, Bryn breezed into the hotel, fit as a fiddle!

Ken Brickell says: The coach we had was like a school bus only worse. When we got to France, we headed north to Dunkirk and the rear suspension gave way and we were stranded for hours on end. We were on our way to Antwerp. Dai Pres broke out all the booze he had bought on the ferry and it was drunk until none remained. Bryn & his wife ended up in hospital with alcohol poisoning and the guy who was organist at one of the London Squares puked all over the driver's jacket before he fell off the bus, cracking open his head. He was helped into the 4* hotel in Antwerp dressed only in his underpants. On the way back, smoke billowed from the coach at every opportunity and when we got to Calais, it could hardly move at all. Fearing it would not get up the hill out of Dover, I cadged a lift on a Belles of Lowestoft coach so that I could get back to Kessingland and home.

From Ken Brickell:

From what I remember, James was in the US and Lyn couldn't do it so David rang and asked if I could conduct. The LPO had been rehearsing that morning at Glyndebourne, so whilst they were setting up, I asked their conductor if I could run through our pieces because I hadn't done anything with the choir for some time. he agreed and when I was finished, he asked me to stay on the rostrum and do it all again where the LPO was involved so that he could listen to the balance at the back of the room. I was gobsmacked, but nevertheless, duly obliged. I then had to travel on the underground back to Newberry Park station to collect my car. I was carrying the biggest bouquet of flowers I'd ever seen. I was afraid to look up in case some thug decided to have a go at me. Elaine was happy to receive them. I was just very proud. Looking at the program again, some literary idiot has put a gap between Gwa and Hoddiad!

Sat 31 March/Sun 1 April 20001 - Roundhouse Camden. 'Because I Sing' written and conducted by Orlando Gough and The Shout for a concert of 16 of London's amateur choirs featuring the Gwalia, a children's choir, a refugee choir, a deaf choir (who signed while the Gwalia sang), London Gay Men's Chorus, Maori, Jewish, Lloyds Insurance and Georgian choirs, a socialist choir, The WI choir and others. Produced by Artangel. We each sang our own songs and then sang Because I Sing together. The concert was reviewed well in the Daily Telegraph (3 April, the press cutting is in the archive). Channel 4 made a documentary (broadcast June 2001) about the project, directed by Sophie Fiennes who filmed one of our rehearsals.

Tues 3 April 2001 - Banqueting House, Whitehall

[we have sung at the Banqueting House several times - it is an amazing venue: Designed by Inigo Jones in 1619 with ceilings painted by Rubens the place has fabulous acoustics and a gory history - Charles I was executed there in 1649]

This was James Hearn's last concert having been Musical Director of the Choir for 5 years.

Steve Davies says: I'm pretty certain that this is where we met Dr Markus Jerger, the organiser of the 2004 Unesco dinner. This was a dinner for hedge-funds, high-wealth individuals and their families. While we were having refreshments in the undercroft the organiser came down and handed out Swiss Army knives and chatted to us. In 2004 he got in touch and invited us to go and sing in at the Unesco Gala Dinner in Geneva, all expenses paid - see 14.10.04.
